¹ under-represented minorities include black non-hispanic, hispaniic, american indian/alaskan native & hawaiian; ² underserved includes any student who is first generation or under-represented minority or low_income (125% of poverty, Fafsa submitted); ³ EFC and family income reported only for those who submitted a FAFSA; ⁴ INCscore is a composite of z value ACT, HS gpa & HS percentile converted to a centile score, values under 25 represent a 3 times greater likelihood of probation in 1st year; ⁵ APAP applicants probability of being on probation 1st year.
