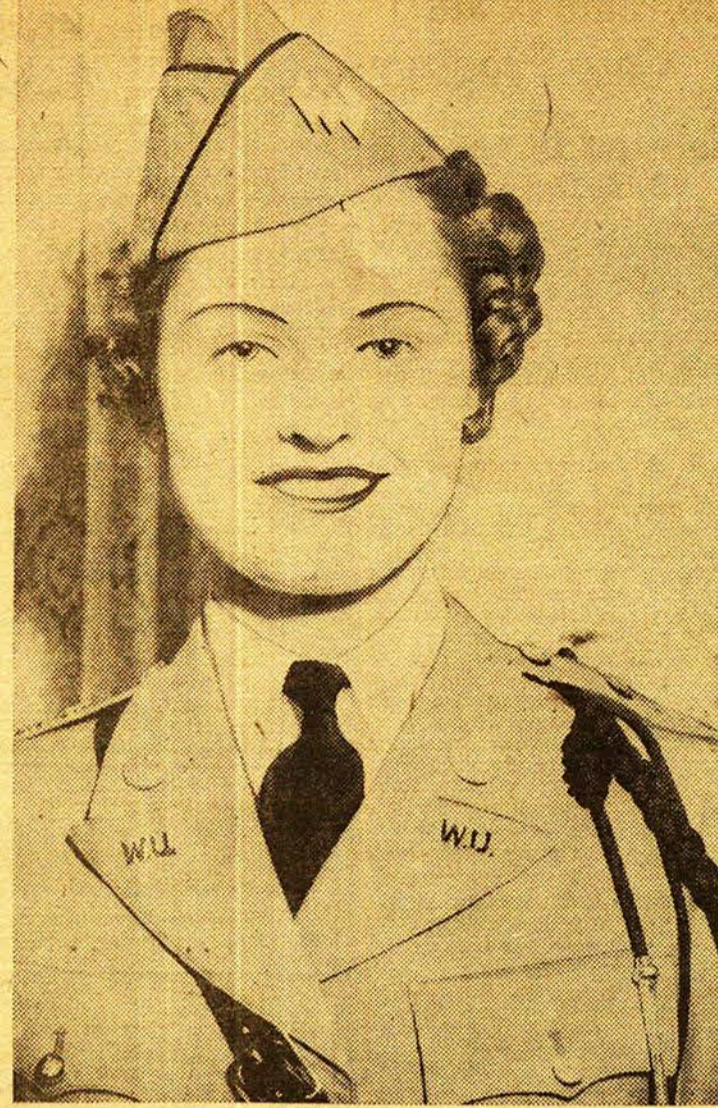

Cage Season Opens With Team at O.U.

Quintet Seeks Norman Victory Over Bix Six Foe

It took a clever University of Oklahoma team to rally and swish three points through the hoop in the last seconds of play here last year to down a spirited Shocker five under a 40-37 score, and Saturday, when the two teams meet at Norman, Wichita will be out to even that score.

The team will drive to Norman, leaving tomorrow afternoon. They are holding final practice here today.

Hennigh Is Silent
Coach Bill Hennigh has declined to make any predictions, but he believes he has a fast and capable squad. A victory over the Big Six team at Norman would give the Shockers an auspicious start for the approaching season.

Pike Gawthrop and Cal Stewart, two of the big guns against O. U. last year, are ready to resume their sharpshooting. Scrimmage this week has shown a marked improvement, with more shots being made, and fewer passes being fumbled. The ball is being handled accurately, and play has been coming into a fine edge, considering the usual early season standards.

Starting Five Uncertain
The starters for Saturday's game have not yet been announced, but it is believed that Gawthrop, Barker and Stewart will be in the opening gun. Wells, Cupit and Jacques will be on hand for the playing line-up.

"Big" Eikermann, another veteran from last year's squad, will also be ready to resume play against the O. U. cagers. Last year he alternated at center position with Stewart, and this year he and Stewart will again control the pivot post.

Co-captain DeHon and Niehage or Strahan will start at guards, if practice indications hold true. All of them are veterans, and have reputations for being difficult to be scored upon.

A victory at Norman will make Shocker hopes for a successful basketball season soar, and the team indicates that they will be fighting vigorously for that good start.

Central Conference power will again be tested with that of the Big Six when Coach Hennigh's cagers encounter the Sooners of the University of Oklahoma at Norman Saturday night. Shocker followers naturally hope for a reversal of last season's three-point loss and such a thing might happen, much to the chagrin of Big Sixes.

Hugh V. McDermott, able and veteran Sooner coach, has produced some mighty forward teams at O. U. as well as some of the nation's top ranking players. Bruce Drake, now a freshman coach there, was one of them. Old timers still say "Well, this boy may be superb but he can't surpass Drake." And they are in all probability correct in their assertions.

The comparative strength of the two teams cannot be determined this early in the season but a closely fought contest can well be anticipated. Maybe there is a potential Drake practicing over there in the gymnasium right now.

Assistant Neely's frosh cage team will probably go against the Coleman Lamp five next Wednesday night as a feature preliminary to the Phillips "66"-Kansas City Missouri Valley A. A. U. clash. Downtown cage fans have had considerable interest in Shocker freshmen teams since the "boy wonders" of 1935 won the City A. A. U. championship so dramatically. Practices indicate that the 1937 group will be no exception from past teams.
