Of University*

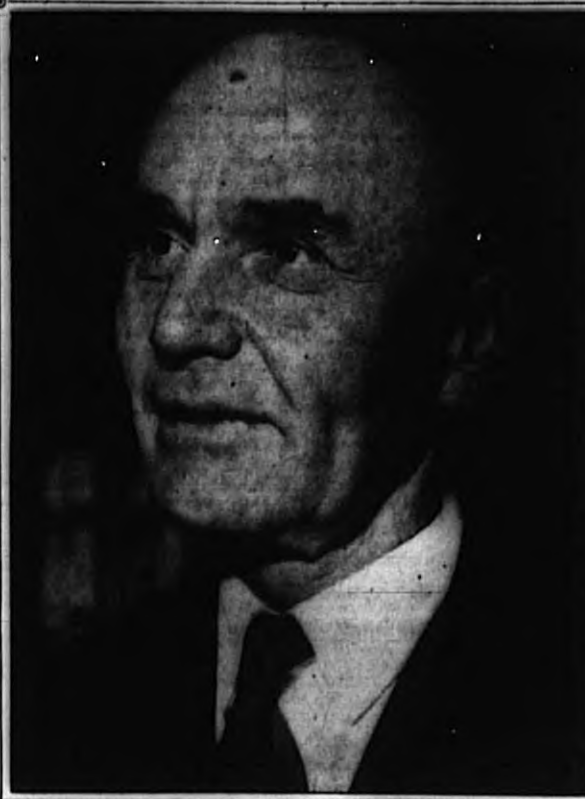
