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Minutes of the Meeting of December 10, 1965

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Wichita State University

December 10 Meeting of the University Faculty

Time: 3 p.m. Friday December 10, 1965

Place: Wilner Auditorium

Presiding: President Lindquist

After the call to order, the chair asked the faculty's pleasure concerning the minutes of the September 14, 1965 meeting of the faculty. There being no response, the chair declared the minutes approved as circulated. He then introduced Mr. Harder who, presented some recommendations from the Senate. The first of these concerned some Senate appointments to standing committees, appointments made to fill vacancies:

- A. To the Tenure and Welfare Committee:

On motion of Mr. Harder, seconded by Mr. Reif, and passed without dissenting vote, the Committee appointments were ratified.

The second Senate recommendation presented by Mr. Harder was that Paragraphs 1 and 2 of the left column on page 14 of the Wichita State University Catalog 1965-66:

1. Any graduate of an accredited Kansas High school who has not previously attended a college will be admitted to Wichita State University. If the student's High School index places him in the lower half of his graduating class, the student will be admitted on probation and the University reserves the right to place him in a remedial Program of its own description.

2. A graduate of an out-of-state accredited high school or preparatory school will be eligible for admission to Wichita State University if the applicant ranks in the upper one-half of his high school graduating class. Exceptions may be made under special circumstances when valid reasons prevail. Priority of admission among out-of-state students will be given to the sons and daughters of alumni of the University.

be so changed as to read:

Any graduate of an accredited Kansas High school who has not previously attended a college will be admitted on application, to Wichita State University. A graduate of an out-of-state accredited high school will be eligible for admission if the applicant ranks in the upper one-half of his high school graduating class. Exceptions may be made under special circumstances when valid reasons prevail.. Priority of admission among out-of-state students will be given to sons and daughters of alumni of the University.

Mr. Harder moved the acceptance by the faculty of the Senate's recommendation and Mr. Fahrbach seconded the motion. A lively discussion followed. Mr. Berg led the discussion with the reading of a prepared statement. Mr. Harder, Mr. Fahrbach, and others spoke for the proposal and various faculty members asked questions, most of which were referred to and answered by Mr. Fahrbach.

When the motion to adopt the recommendation was put, it passed by a viva voce vote. Mr. Berg asked that his statement on the recommendations be included in the minutes and the chair ordered that his request be granted. (See copy appended.)

Mr. Harder distributed copies of a "Report of United Fund Contributions by Faculty and Staff." (See copy appended.)*

Mr. Harder then made a brief informal report on forthcoming work by the Senate, of matters under consideration, and of actions pending.

*A copy will be appended to the official copy of the minutes, but to save expense, no copy is being distributed with the minutes.

The chair then introduced Mrs. Froning who, for the University Curriculum Committee, presented the following recommendations:

That the statement on page 20 of the current University Catalogue, setting forth the core curriculum requirements in history be changed to read:

III. Humanities:

- b. History: 101 (4), 102 (4); 113 (3), 114 (3), 131 (4), 132 (4), and all upper division courses except 300 and 498.

That the statement on page 20 of the current University Catalogue setting forth core curriculum requirements in economics be changed to read:

IV. Social Sciences

- a. Economics: 221 (3), 222 (3), and any upper division course.

On motion of Mrs. Froning, seconded by Mr. Nickel, the recommendations were adopted.

At this time, the hour being late, the chair asked chairmen of the two military science departments to delay their reports, and no objection being forthcoming, declared the meeting adjourned.
