D JUSTIFICATION OF NEED

The two-year certificate in Administration of Justice now granted by Wichita State University is comparable to the Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees awarded by community colleges. The two-year certificate designation is not as descriptive nor as prestigious to students and employers as is the Associate degree. On the basis that students should receive equal recognition for a similar amount of college course work completed, Wichita State University requests permission to grant an Associate of Science degree in Administration of Justice.

Wichita State University has offered a two-year program in Administration of Justice (previously Police Science) since 1961. From that time until after WSU's entry into the State system, an Associate of Applied Science degree was awarded. After entry into the State system, the designation was changed to a Certificate of Applied Science, at the direction of the Board of Regents.

E. INVENTORY OF EXISTING RESOURCES

All of the courses listed above are now being offered through the present program.

F. ESTIMATES OF REQUIRED ADDITIONAL RESOURCES AND THEIR COST

The change in the program designation will require no change in the cost of the program, nor would it require any change in course offerings or in staff.

Minutes of the adjourned Meeting of November 18, 1974 (Vol. XI. 5)

- I. The meeting was called to order at 3:35 p.m. by President Camin.
- II. The Chair asked permission to waive the reading of the Senate Minutes of the November 11 meeting. There being no objection, she briefly reviewed the actions taken during that meeting.
- V. Mr. Perel moved that the Administration of Justice program (Attachment A) be given Associate Degree Status. The motion passed.

Mr. Paske moved that Senate action with respect to the Retirement Report be reconsidered at the December 9 meeting of the Senate. Mr. Paske discussed a number of reasons for the proposed reconsideration. The motion was seconded by Mr. Greenberg and passed.

The Community College Transfer Agreement Amendment No. 4 (submitted by Mr. Jakowatz at the November 11 meeting) was discussed. It was moved and seconded to add "health professions bound" to the paragraph. The motion passed. A friendly amendment was made to add "that" after "provided". It was then moved and seconded to change "expectation" to "requirement". The motion passed. The final amendment as amended now reads:

"The College of Engineering would support the articulation agreement provided that engineering and health related professions bound students would be able to submit 6 hours less in humanities and social sciences and 6 more in mathematics and natural science, with the requirement that they complete the humanities and social sciences upon transfer."

Mr. Perel discussed the transfer agreement. Mr. Rogers moved the following: If the four amendments cannot be secured by the Vice-President the document will be returned to the Senate for reconsideration. The motion was seconded.

Mr. Breazeale spoke about the transfer agreement in light of its general status as viewed from the six Regents' institutions as well as the Community Colleges. After considerable discussion, Mr. Rogers withdrew his motion.

The following motion was made relative to the amendments pertaining to the Transfer Agreement (See Attachment B, Page 10 of the meeting of November 11, 1974):

"I move approval of the Community College Transfer agreement as amended and authorize the Vice-President of Academic Affairs to act in behalf of WSU to attempt to secure the above amendments. If these amendments cannot be secured by the Vice-President, it is understood that the Senate approves the agreement without amendments."

The motion passed by voice vote.

Mr. Reif spoke to the proposed Liberal Arts Associate of Arts Degree. (See page B-13, Attachment B, Meeting of November 4, 1974). A motion was made to adopt the degree. After discussion, the motion to accept the Liberal Arts Associate of Arts Degree passed.

Mr. Lee Smith spoke to the proposed Associate of Science Degree. (See page B-14, Attachment B, Meeting of November 11, 1974). The Associate of Science Degree was moved for adoption. Mr. Rogers moved to change the hours required in Composition and Speech from 6 to 9 hours. Mr. Greenberg seconded. The motion failed. After further discussion, the motion to accept the generalized Associate of Science Degree passed.

VIII. The meeting adjourned at 4:55 p.m.
