Dr. Muma,

Since you already have approval to offer 50% or more of some programs online (as you do in seven cases), they are considered distance education programs. You don't need approval to offer them 100% online. Please see the link below regarding Commission policy, especially Item 5:

In addition, you should know that the Commission has moved away from the percentage brackets (0, 5, 20, and 100; perhaps you received communication about that this summer) to four new categories which are the following: not approved, approved for courses, approved for courses and one program, and approved for courses and programs. It is my understanding that in the case of your institution, you would be placed in the last category since you already have approved online programs. That stipulation on your SAS will be changed shortly. That means that you can offer other courses or programs online as you wish (as long as the courses or programs are not substantially different from your present offerings) without further Commission approval.

I hope this makes sense. If not, please let me know.

Dear Dr. Ahuja,

Thank you for taking my call today. I'm writing to seek clarification of our status in terms of our approval to offer online programs. On our statement of affiliation status (on your website) it states that we are approved to offer up to 20% of our total degree programs through distance education. However, when we were last reviewed in 2007 (see attached letter dated September 10, 2007) we were approved to only offer four programs (RN-BSN completion program, MA in

criminal justice, MA in Gerontology [renamed aging studies], MEd in curriculum and instruction). At the same time a focused visit was mandated in 2009-2010 “to ensure that the infrastructure for distance delivery remained adequate to support online degree programs that were approved.”

In 2009 Wichita State University requested a postponement for the offering of full online degree programs because of budget cuts (see attached letter dated April 23, 2009). This postponement was approved by the Commission and we have not offered full online degree programs (see attached letter dated May 11, 2009).

In the meantime, two additional programs were added to the list of online programs when HLC required us to report programs with >50% online courses, to be listed as online programs. These additional programs are the dental hygiene completion program and the bachelor of criminal justice. All six of our programs (plus one certificate) have been included in our annual report (see second attachment, page 15).

Between 2009 and 2013, we have been slowly putting together an infrastructure to support online degree programs. We now have an office of online learning, a director for the office, on-staff instructional designers and technologists, professional development, the means to properly support the office and needed technology, and other related support.

My question to you: what is the process to seek approval from HLC to offer fully online degree programs, in light of the information I have provided and HLC’s notation that WSU is approved to offer up to 20% of our total degree programs through distance education?

I appreciate your willingness to assist Wichita State University as we seek to expand online learning.

Dear Dr. Taylor:

Thank you for meeting with Provost Miller and Associate Provost Shawver regarding our concerns about proceeding with implementation of our on line program development. Recall, that during our last reaccreditation in 2006, we requested a change of status to allow us to develop and deploy fully on-line degree programs. We received approval for this but were scheduled for a focused visit in the spring of 2010. The review committee was concerned about whether our administrative and financial structure would sustain on-line programs.

Over the past year a task force examined these issues in some detail and developed a plan to provide adequate support for on-line programming. The plan, which I approved this past fall, called for the redirection of substantial funds to the on-line program including the hiring of several on-line course directors and an e-learning director and increased funding for technology and faculty development. Unfortunately, because of deep budget cuts in the current year and even deeper reductions in the coming fiscal year, we will not be able to provide the resources necessary to meet our expectations for a program of excellence in e-learning.

I therefore respectfully request a postponement of our request for a change of status to offer full on-line degree programs. Until the current economic situation turns around, we believe it would not be in our best interests or that of our students to pursue this initiative. The current programs approved for full implementation at the last accreditation site visit in 2007, will remain but will not be transformed into full on-line programs as requested.

I am most appreciative of your consideration of this request which I understand may receive immediate staff action with ultimate Commission approval. Please feel free to contact me, Dr. Miller or Dr. Shawver if you have questions about this request.

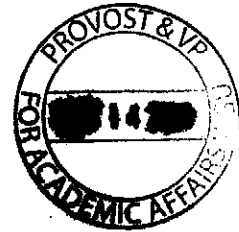

Dear Dr. Beggs:

I am writing as a follow-up to the conference that I had with Provost Gary Miller and Associate Provost Martha Shawver at the Commission's Annual Meeting in mid-April, and to your letter of April 23, 2009. The issue discussed during both venues was the scheduled Commission mandated focused visit to determine the extent to which the University had been successful in launching its planned and approved extensive online delivery of academic programs.

You made clear in your letter that due to deep budget cuts made during the current year, and even deeper reductions anticipated in the coming fiscal year, the University will not be able to provide the resources necessary to support the proposed, expanded online delivery efforts that had been planned, and were evaluated by the team that visited the institution on March 26-28, 2007. Therefore, you requested that the Commission cancel the focused visit (scheduled to be conducted during the Spring of 2009 to *ensure that the infrastructure for distance delivery remains adequate to support the online degree programs that have been approved*). My review of the May 30, 2007 *Final Team Report* indicates that the University had recommended approval of the University's request to offer five new online degree programs, as follows:

- RN-BSN Completion Program
- Master of Arts in Criminal Justice
- Master of Arts in Gerontology
- Master of Education in Curriculum and Instruction
- Master of Arts in Teaching in Curriculum and Instruction

Based on your letter of April 23, it is my understanding that the University has not provided the resources needed to support the online delivery of the degree programs. Therefore, it is my understanding that the University has not begun offering these programs in an online format.




The Commission's records show that the University currently has approval only to offer only the following academic programs:

- Master of Arts in Criminal Justice
- Master of Arts in Gerontology
- Master of Education (Curriculum and Instruction)
- RN-BSN Degree Completion Program
- Certificate in Reading Endorsement-Education

In this context, should the University decide that it wishes to offer additional online degree programs, it will need to submit a new *change request* to the Commission for evaluation. Enclosed is a revised *Statement of Affiliation Status* that reflects the staff action I have taken to cancel the planned focused visit. Dear Colleague:

This message provides important information regarding your institution's approval for distance delivered programs.

In July 2010, the Commission revised its policies for and definitions of distance and correspondence education and has since been working to ensure that all accredited institutions have the appropriate reviews and approvals as required. During this transition period, the Commission has maintained a generic statement regarding distance and correspondence education in each institution's Statement of Affiliation Status (SAS). This generic statement replaced any prior existing language relative to approval of distance delivered programs.

The generic statement has now been updated to reflect the reviews and approvals that have occurred. Please review your institution's SAS.

Related to this change, on March 5 you received an e-mail from the Commission announcing the opening period for filing the Institutional Update. One section of the Institutional Update offers you the opportunity to review and revise the programs you've listed as being offered by distance and correspondence education. It is important that you review and complete this section of the Institutional Update with care given the implications for Title IV. For more information, see <http://ncahlc.org/Annual-Institutional-Data-Update/2011-2012-institutional-update.html>.

Please be aware that distance education is approved separately from correspondence education. Further, some changes may result in the need for further review of your distance and correspondence education.

- If the total number of degree programs offered through distance

education or correspondence education changes, this may require additional review and approval.

- Commission reviews are required when distance or correspondence degree programs expand beyond 5% of total degree programs and when distance or correspondence degree programs expand beyond 20% of total degree programs offered.
