Sept. 29, 1924

The meeting was called to order by the president. The bill for the Student Hand Books was presented by Irene Coleman. It was moved and second that the Student Council allow \$30 on the bill. Carried. Motion was made and carried that the Student Council buy stationary. Carried. Suggestions were made that the Freshmen be put on the committee to clean trophies to be put in the new trophy case. Motion made and carried that the next meeting of Student Council be held Monday Oct. 6 at 7:30. Motion made and carried that there be only three unexcused absences to the meetings. Meeting adjourned.

Oct. 6, 1924

The meeting was called to order by the president. Motion made and carried that the Student Council buy the caps for the boys who belong to the Rooters Club. Also moved and second that 100 of the 25¢ caps be ordered. The minutes were read and approved. Moved and second for secretary to cast an unanimous ballot for Dale Gard as chairman of the pep committee. Carried. Moved and second for secretary to cast an unanimous ballot for Sally Lahey as reporter for the Student Council. Carried. Darling Crum was elected as chairman of the social committee. Meeting adjourned.

Oct. 13, 1924.

The president called the meeting to order. Plans for Home Coming Day of Nov. 7 were laid. Suggested that 500 extra Sunflowers be printed with invitation on front page to the Alumni. The following committee was appointed to look after this: Archie Booth-chairman, Irene Coleman and Gwen. Graham. Suggested to have a parade before South Western game. Minutes were read and approved. Definite action was taken regarding Chapel order. The classes are to sit together. The 1st 5 rows are reserved for the Seniors, behind them the Juniors, the Sophomores in the 1st rows on the outside and Freshmen behind them. Each member of the Student Council to see that members of own class set in right places. A bill of \$6.50 presented by Dale Gard. Moved and second to allow this bill. Carried. Moved and second to cast an unanimous ballot for Miss Louva Crum as accompanist in Student Chapel. Carried. Moved and second to have next meeting on Nov. 3. Carried. Meeting adjourned.

Bill of \$10.50 for Sunflower, moved and second to be allowed. Carried. Money for foot balls was to be turned into the treasurer. Moved and second to allow \$3.50 flower bill. Carried. Question of cleaning trophy cups discussed. Moved and second to have Student Council meeting Nov. 17 at Sally Lahey's home 629 N. Lawrence at 7:30. Carried. Meeting adjourned.

Nov. 17, 1924

The meeting of Student Council was held at the home of Sally Lahey on Nov. 17. The meeting was called to order by the President. Minutes were read and approved. A letter from the Student Council of Mc Pherson inquiring of our Council was read by the president. Bills for Home Coming party of \$9.70 for doughnuts and \$7.00 for sider were allowed. Dale Gard was appointed to take charge of colors and parade and Social committee to take charge of eats for Wed. coming before Thanksgiving game. The next meeting was set for Dec. 8 with the Student Activities Committee of the Faculty in Miss Wilkies office. Meeting adjourned.

The resignation of Dale Gard as Chairman of Pep Committee was read, it was moved and seconded to accept the resignation. Carried. Bill Hysom was elected as the new chairman.

February 5th, 1925.

President called meeting to order, Minutes were read and approved. Moved and seconded to accept Miss Palmers excuse of absence from meeting. Carried. It was agreed to have regular meeting of Student Council every other Monday.

Moved and seconded to buy sweater for Dale Gard. Money taken out of Student Council and presented in name of Student Council. Carried. The following committee was appointed to see Coach Hill about Sweater, Byron Chappel and Walter Woods.

Matter regarding Rooter Caps brought up. Friday Feb. 13th set as day of presentation of flag by D.A.R.. The following committee was appointed to take charge of Chapel Friday, Feb. 13th. <sup>Archie</sup> Dickie Booth and Sally Lahey.

The new constitution was read, moved and seconded that this constitution be accepted by the Student Council, typewritten and meet with committee from Faculty. Carried.

February 16, 1925.

March 9th, 1925.

The constitution was gone over by articles and sections and all questionable parts discussed and decided upon.

The Honor Court was discussed. The following committee was appointed to take up all information concerning Honor Court: Sally Lahey, Mary L. Kelley & Byron Chappel.

The constitution is to be revised by the Council and then come before the faculty and if passed, then submitted to the Student Body.

April 8th was designated as Clean Up Day. The following were appointed to look after all arrangements for said day: Walter Woods, Chairman, Winnifred Palmer, Mary Tipler Sam Grimes.

Dale Gard's Sweater has been ordered and is on the way.

Regular meeting was held March 23. The president called the meeting to order. A report on Clean Up Day was given. Coach Hill announced that he would take charge of Inter-Class Track meet.

Minutes were read and approved

A parade advertising the Municipal University was discussed. It was moved and seconded that the Student Council give a prize of \$10 for 1st best float, \$5.00 for 2nd Best and \$5.00 for best decorated car. Carried. Announcement of Parade is to be made in each Society. The judges are to be the Student Activities Committee of the Faculty.

April 20, 1925.

Regular meeting of Student Council was held April 20th. President called the meeting to order. The minutes were read and approved.

April 20th, Con't

The constitution was discussed. It was moved and second that to place a name in nomination for Student Council Officers, it was necessary to have a petition with 25 names and must be signed by the nominee and one circulating petition. In case one person signed two petitions for the same office, their name was to be stricken from both petitions. Carried. The election committee was to be composed of Student Council members.

Bills of \$21.00 for Parnassus and 75¢ for Honor Cards were allowed.

Class Day Exercises were discussed.

April 29th, 1925.

A special meeting of Student Council was called after chapel. The President presided.

The voting was to take place in the Gym between classes. The Polls opened at 8:00 o'clock and closed at 1:30.

Walter Woods is registrar for boys and Winifred Palmer for girls. May 7th is election day.

May 11, 1925.

The minutes were read and approved. It was moved and second to allow the following bills: Carried.

Archie Booth suggested Chapel of good musical entertainment.

\$25.00 due from Booster Club. (Estimate) The Booster Club is either to return caps or 25¢/ Also Cheer Leaders are to return uniforms.

Moved and second that the President of the Booster Club account for money or caps. Carried. Sam Grimes appointed to look after matter of caps and cheer leaders' suits.

The last meeting of the year of Student Council was held June 1st, at the home of Gwendolyn Graham. After a dinner, the regular business meeting was held. The President presided.

The minutes were read and approved.

Sam Grimes made a report on the caps of the Booster Club. 10 caps were returned and \$32.50 turned in to the Student Council Treasury.

It was moved and second to place order for caps for Booster Club and to keep extra money for Student Council. Carried.

A discussion as to ways of spending the money left in Treasury. Moved and second to appoint a committee to take charge of buying sweaters for the new booster club next year. Carried. This club would consist of 12 boys and 12 girls. When they fail to attend a game, then someone else is taken from the waiting list and allowed to join. The Committee is composed of Orville VanHorn, Gwen Graham and Mary L. Kelley.

Moved and second to allow \$6.00 to Costume Company and \$1.00 to Bill Hysom.

Moved and second to a vote of thanks to Miss Graham for her hospitality. carried.
