Eye Beach. Sept. 8

My darling John,

Your good long letter
came last night, but I shall send
only a poor note in reply because
I have caught a violent cold
which will hardly let me open
my eyes enough to write at all.

A severe cold in the night and
I suppose it was then that I caught
it. I am sorry for I was feeling
very well & expected to go home
wonderfully bright. I shall do all
I can to break it up. Baby seems
bright & I think is improving in
every way; I wish her friends would
get quite bright, they are much better
than they were, but not exactly as they
should be. Mother left this morning
and we have moved into her
