My dear Brother,- I was glad to hear from you, though I have nothing new to report in reply, except that Dr. Pearsons has written that he is thinking seriously about what I said concerning Wichita. I have not referred to it since I was in Chicago, but he did in his last letter which I received on Saturday. I am very much delighted that he is taking the matter under consideration; and you may rest assured I shall not fail to diligently cultivate him. I think now I shall send him a copy of your letter to Dr. Willcox; and when you have anything of importance, let me have it to forward him.

I hope your canvass in Kansas will offer you much encouragement. Dr. Hamilton feels quite disturbed, because the interest has not been paid on the bonds held by Hartford parties, who are his special friends, and he has urgently requested me not to consent to the forwarding of the balance due on last year's pledge until at least another coupon shall have been taken care of. However, there has not been money enough in the treasury, though I think that within a week or two it may be possible to send \$200. At least it will be sent if possible.
