Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of January 22nd, relative to the case of Miss Blanche Imboden. I advise you that Miss Imboden will be required to meet the following requirements before she can graduate: she must complete all the required work, and the College from which she graduated must certify on a regular transcript to this department. Her only course, if she desires to take this work in Fairmount, would be to have assurances to her from Baker, that Baker will accept your work and give her credit for the same and certify her to this department, as required by the State Board of Education. She could not get a certificate on completing this work in Fairmount alone, because the State Board objects very rightly to dividing responsibility in this matter.
