Dear Dr. Breazeale:

Some weeks ago I asked you about the possibility of the University combining the posts of Secretary of the University Senate and Secretary of the Faculty into a fractional or full-time clerical position. I would like to take this opportunity to set forth my reasoning on the matter.

The task of Secretary of the University Senate is an onerous one--time-consuming, maddening, and an imposition on any faculty member unfortunate enough to be elected to the post. I estimate that during the academic year of 1973-1974 I spent between 150 and 200 hours on Senate work, performing clerical tasks (taking notes for minutes, supervising their writing, proofing the final typing, compiling the agenda, and haranguing my colleagues in order to secure from them appropriate attachments for coming meetings). Admittedly, my job was made far easier because I was able to rely upon an especially efficient student assistant, most of the time, but there were problems even here; I could not justify asking her to compose minutes and do other Senate work, when such conflicted with her own academic career. Consequently, I occasionally was saddled with the entire task. Add to that other University service-- chairing a policy committee and regular attendance on two other (technical and advisory) committees--and I had very little time to perform adequately the job of teaching, for which I was hired. Dean Rhatigan once poignantly asked me if I were allowing my classes to interfere with my University service. And although I have not talked with Dr. Walters, I suspect that she would verify my tale of woe insofar as the position of Secretary of the General Faculty is concerned.

By combining the two faculty-service posts into one clerical position, the University would gain. First of all, two professors would be freed to serve the University in far more meaningful ways--through better teaching, more research and writing, and/or service on College and/or University committees in which their professional expertise could be use. Indeed, any simpleton--as I think I have adequately demonstrated--can fulfill the requirements of Secretary. Second, such a combined clerical position would

allow for more coordination between the Senate and the General Faculty. Matters that must be forwarded from the Senate to the General Faculty would stand a far greater chance of being placed on the agenda and of being mailed to the faculty on time; changes in the Constitution and in the rules of the Senate would be far more likely to be properly added to appropriate documents; and the level of communication between the two bodies, I believe, would be improved significantly. Moreover, a permanent Secretary would enable both bodies to maintain far more orderly files-- documents which would become more readily available to all members of the academic community.

Guidance would have to come from the officers of the Senate and from the Dean of Faculties, but I perceive no major problem in this area. Such a change would cost the University several thousand dollars annually, but I contend that it would pay dividends through the more efficient use of manpower and talents.

I would be happy to discuss my proposal with you and/or Dr. Ahlberg, should you wish it.

(REPLY REQUESTED BY FRIDAY FEBRUARY 15)

Unassigned *Indeed!* Obviously not any one of us! But as you probably know full well, university governance is organized around the natural (academic) divisions where elections are conducted. Those of us whose major assignments are not in instruction participate in governance through a catch-all category called UNASSIGNED FACULTY.

By tradition the Dean of University College has been asked to certify the electorate and to coordinate elections, nominations and appointments.

I need your attention to three specific items by Friday evening, February 15:

1. Your assistance in confirming the electorate in your area.
2. Your advance notice of impending senate elections next week by Friday, February 22.
3. Your advance notice of committee vacancies for which you may make a nomination.

### 1. CONFIRMING THE UNASSIGNED ELECTORATE

Attached is a list of unassigned faculty corrected (tentatively) by our office February, 1974. All full-time personnel with rank of instructor or higher and all part-time appointments of .5 or more with rank of instructor or higher are eligible to vote and hold office. (For part-time appointments, one of the following two additional qualifications must be met: (1) appointed for at least three of the last five semesters; and/or (2) if part-time appointment is at faculty person's own request, it follow a period of at least one year on a full-time basis.)

Please make sure that your division, department or office head confirms the electorate list. *Return to me by Friday, February 15.*

### 2. ANNOUNCING SENATE ELECTIONS

Of the four senators elected by the unassigned electorate two are completing two-year terms and are eligible for re-election.



Dear Dean McKibbin:

You are hereby notified that elections to fill regular terms in the WSU Senate should be held in February and certification of those results forwarded to me no later than Friday, February 22. The regular, two-year terms of the following representatives from your College expire this year.

These persons are eligible for reelection. You should take care in assembling the list of persons comprising the electorate from the division(s) under your jurisdiction to consider all persons to be eligible (on the basis of the following rules) whose eligibility is current, whether or not their return to eligibility in the fall semester is anticipated.

The following resolution adopted by the University Senate on February 26, 1973, defines the electorate and eligibility for election to the Senate:

1. Faculty and staff eligible for election to the University Senate shall be the University electorate.
2. The University electorate shall be eligible for full participation in University faculty meetings.
3. Efforts should be made to see that members of the University electorate have full participatory privileges in college and departmental governance.

FURTHER THAT

The University electorate shall be defined as

1. Full time personnel with rank of Instructor or higher
- or
2. Part time personnel with fractional time appointments of .5 or more with rank of Instructor or higher, providing
    - a. that if initially employed on a .5 or more fractional basis that they have had appointment for at least three semesters (summers may be included) in the preceding five semesters.
- or
- b. that if appointment on a .5 or more fractional basis is made at the person's own request that it follow a period of at least one year on a full time basis.

FURTHER THAT

Article I, Section 5 of the University Senate Constitution be interpreted to reflect the following:

1. Election to the University Senate shall be from the divisions as constituted by various University Senate actions.
2. Divisional eligibility requires .5 or more salary support from that divisional budget or to be a tenured faculty member from that division.
3. In no instance may a person be eligible for election from more than one division.
4. Persons otherwise eligible for election but who have no divisional identification as previously defined shall be eligible for election from the Unassigned division.
5. Persons employed in the following positions shall be eligible for election from the Unassigned division, regardless of rank: Associate Dean of Admissions, Project TOGETHER Director.

On this basis, your office should prepare and circulate a list of those persons eligible for election. A copy of this document should be forwarded to the Secretary of the University Senate (Box 78) no later than February 15; any dispute arising over voting rights and/or eligibility for office should be appealed to the Senate's Agenda Committee prior to the election. Especial care should be exercised to assure that no one is inadvertently disfranchised. Those tenured faculty who hold fractional appointments in your College but are housed in another (or in administrative slots) must be included in the election process.
