Cal. through their Kansas City Office sent us 23
Volumes superbly bound selected from their pub-
lications. This was accompanied with a most
cordial letter.

Church of U.S. have come in 9 bound 8vo Volumes
sent from Philadelphia free of charge.

We have at this writing entered 4971 Volumes.
Very nearly the 5000. desired before New Years.

very active in aiding the work. I shall help Bosworth
out tomorrow. with a sermon in the morning.
