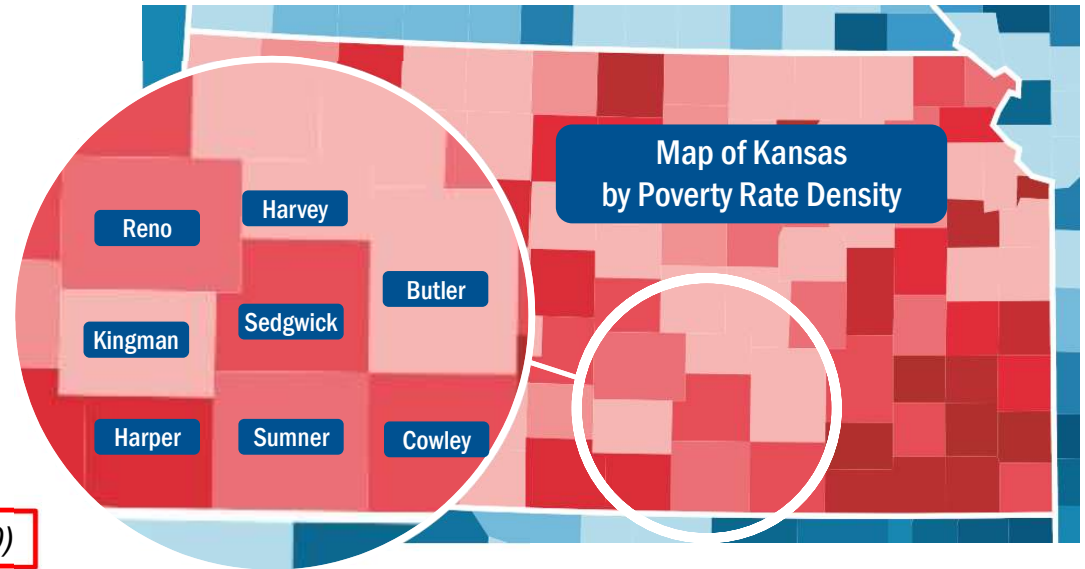

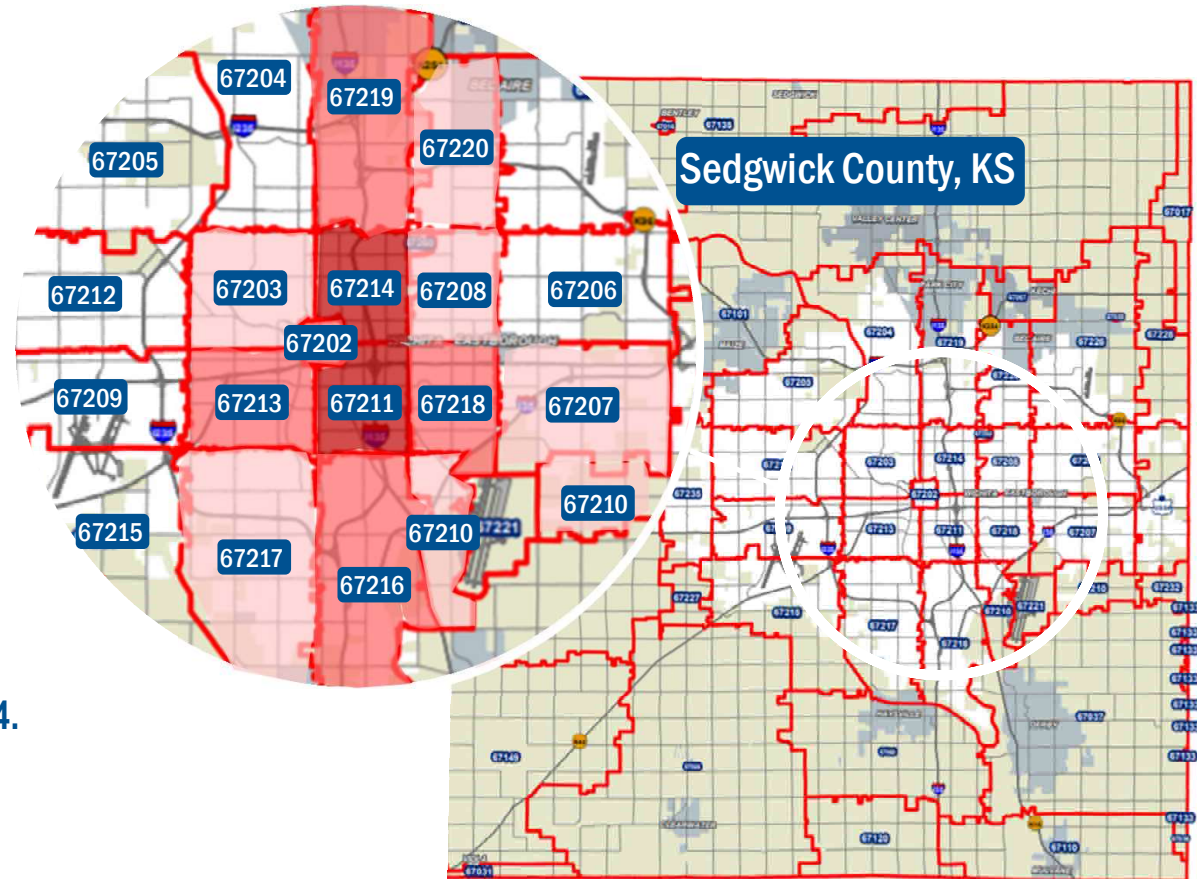

Wu's Big Event

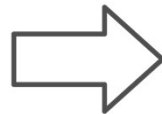
