

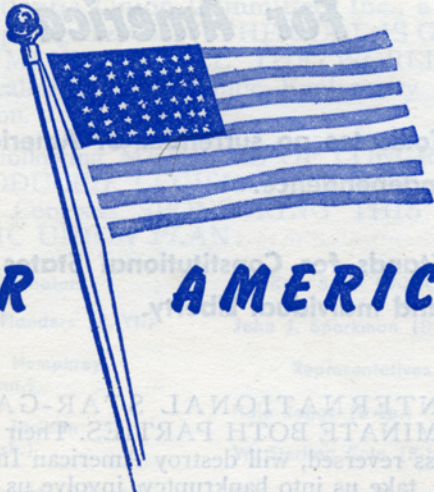

INTERNATIONAL STAR-GAZERS DOMINATE BOTH PARTIES. Their policies, unless reversed, will destroy American Independence, take us into bankruptcy, involve us in more **FOREIGN WARS.**

There is a strong movement to yield American Independence by joining **ATLANTIC UNION AND WORLD GOVERNMENT** through the United Nations.

After three wars in forty years, which have produced nothing but debt and failure and white crosses, we are still being told that Political Union with Foreign Powers is necessary for our survival.

Don't these people ever learn anything?

Shall we let them **REPEAL** the Declaration of Independence?

What happens when the United States enters the Atlantic Union or World Government?

The Super-State, with authority to enforce world law, would take out of our hands the decision and means to defend ourselves. Our sovereignty would pass into the hands of foreign politicians. The Atlantic Union or World State would dictate the terms under which Americans would be forced to live. The United States, stripped of sovereignty, defenseless, might be forced to send our youth to fight under the Atlantic Union or World State banner anywhere on the globe.

Who Are These People Who Stand for Internationalism and for Political Union with Other Powers?

Dr. Milton Eisenhower: Described the UN as "one more step in our halting, painful, but I think very real progress toward a genuine world government."¹

Governor W. Averell Harriman: the security and progress of the United States are "so intimately bound up with the security and progress of the whole Atlantic world that the two are in fact synonymous."² The Atlantic Union Committee presented Harriman with its 1952 ATLANTIC AWARD.

Hon. Thomas E. Dewey: "I am an internationalist. That's why I am for Eisenhower. Eisenhower is a Republican at heart — but more important than that is that he is an internationalist."³

Hon. Adlai Stevenson: "Looking back today with the hindsight of over 30 years, we also know that his (Woodrow Wilson) vision of a community of nations under law was—and is—the only road to lasting peace."⁴

President Dwight D. Eisenhower: ". . . a firm agreement [is required] that in disputes between nations a central and joint agency, after examination of the facts, shall decide the justice of the case by majority vote and thereafter shall have the power and the means to enforce its decision. This is a slight restriction indeed on nationalism and a small price to pay if thereby the peoples who stand for human liberty are better fitted to settle dissension within their own ranks or to meet attack from without."⁵

This View of Our President is Worth Illustrating:

Suppose certain foreign governments, with a surplus of Reds and labor, demand unrestricted immigration into the United States. We object, but it is put up to a vote and a majority decides against us. What then?

President Eisenhower says that this Federated World Government should have the power and the means to enforce its decision.

It is, of course, assumed that United States troops would be part of this World Army, Navy and Air Force. According to the President's logic, however, these American servicemen would have to fight against their own country and compel it to yield. This would be an act of loyalty to World Government and treason against the United States!

(The foregoing is only one of a dozen vital issues to which his "logic" would apply.)

The Eisenhower Secretary of State, JOHN FOSTER DULLES, is a one-worlder. Here follows his "requisite principles for peace":⁶

- ▶ Ultimately, 'a world government of delegated powers.'
- ▶ Complete abandonment of United States isolationism.
- ▶ Strong immediate limitations on national sovereignty.
- ▶ International control of all armies and navies.
- ▶ 'A universal system of money . . . so planned as to prevent inflation and deflation.'
- ▶ World-wide freedom of immigration.

- ▶ Progressive elimination of all tariff and quota restrictions on world trade. * * *
- ▶ A 'democratically controlled' international bank 'to make development capital available in all parts of the world' . . . * * *''⁶

NOTE: "Worldwide freedom of immigration" means that American wage-scales would be reduced to world levels. Are American working men for that?
