Crime Prevention Tips from University Police

Do you keep your purse under your desk or your wallet in your jacket pocket? If so, chances are you may become a victim of a crime.

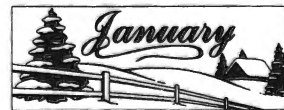
It takes an average thief less than a minute to steal a wallet from an unsecured purse or from your jacket pocket!

Don't take chances with your money, credit cards and checkbook. Designate a desk drawer, file cabinet drawer or cabinet with a lock to hold purses or other personal property.

It is also a good idea to lock your office door when you "leave for just a minute." Let your coworkers know when you are leaving so they can watch your work area.

Call the University Police Department at 3450 anytime you are the victim of a crime or an attempted crime, no matter how small the loss. Your information may lead to the arrest of a suspect committing the same crime in another building.
